▶ **I have a MacBook Pro which I back up via Time Machine to a USB 2.0 Western Digital My Passport Elite portable 250GB hard drive. It worked fine for 9 months and then the backup failed. The drive no longer shows up on the desktop any more and Disk Utility saw it but failed to fix it. Is there a more reliable brand? Someone suggested G-Technology. (I have bought other things from OWC and have been happy with their stuff.)**

■ I see some 5400 rpm G-Drive mini models at the Apple store and they now have a 3 year warranty for their G-Drive mini Combo which offers FireWire 400 as well as USB 2.0. I've been recommending the Other World Computing's Mercury On-The-Go Pro models which tend to be cheaper, offer more speed and capacity and connection options and still reliable with 3 year warranties. The FireWire interface requires less CPU interaction and is generally faster and supplies more power than USB can, which is required for the higher capacity drives. The MacBook Pro has a FireWire 800 interface which is faster yet and OWC has a triple interface model with 7200 rpm drive for top performance. At \$154.99 and you can add Prosoft *Drive Genius 2* for just \$30 more. The triple interface 250GB 7200rpm G-Drive mini is \$259.00, so it's not much of a bargain. If you choose to be desk-bound for backup, the desktop Mercury Elite-AL Pro models use 3.5" hard drives and a AC adapter, but these drives are designed to last longer than mobile 2.5" drives. The triple interface 250GB 7200 rpm model is \$128.99.

▶ **Do you know of any program that can compare two images and show you the differences or a program that can show you the differences in a text file?**

■ I see *AKS Image Comparer* for just \$14 and a few other programs that compare images, but these are Windows XP only programs. There is a Mac OS X program *Differences Examiner* for text files made by AlphaOmega Software. It's only \$18.83 at the current exchange rate with the euro. See <http://alpha-omega.software.free.fr/differencesexaminer/Differences%20Examiner.html> You could always open both images in Adobe

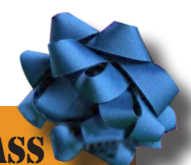

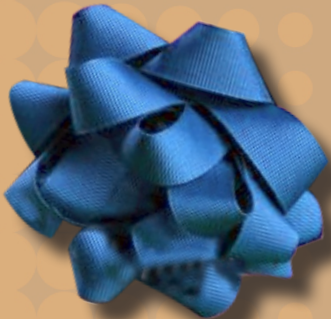

Holiday Gift Ideas

An iTunes gift card makes a great stocking stuffer. It's not just for music, it's good for movie purchases and rentals, and iPod games and iPhone/iPod touch apps. An iPod shuffle would fit too. \$49 or \$69 for 1 or 2GB. A nice case or protective film is also nice, cheap and small. Of course you can make a gift of a paid membership to our user group. Maybe a kit of iLear (Apple Polish Kit) screen and computer cleaner and microfiber cloth to maintain the computer, with a can of compressed air to keep the innards clean. \$29.95 A new memory card for their digital camera or a blank tape for their digital camcorder would be nice if you know the type in use. Also small package. A gift certificate for buy.com or amazon.com works for a wide range of goodies. Impressive by weight, a pack of blank quality Verbatim CD-R or DVD-R discs would be useful to most users. If you get a spindle pack, then some jewel cases or a carry case would be good. Some people prefer the full size jewel cases, as they can have a label on the edge, which the slim types lack. I just bought a 50 pack of double jewel cases from Neato.com They also make a CD label or jewel case insert kit \$24.95 that works as a gift too. You can get a month's subscription to lynda.com training videos for just \$25.

If the budget is better, than consider a Apple Store One-to-One membership for a year's worth of private lessons. An external FireWire 400 hard drive, say a cheaper OWC Neptune series 250GB HD is \$92.99 or 320GB is \$99.95 If you buy a copy of Micromat TechTool Pro for \$83 that may save the day some day when things go bad, and can keep things running smoothly. If you buy now, you get version 4.6.2 and just around Christmas, they will ship out the free upgrade to version 5.

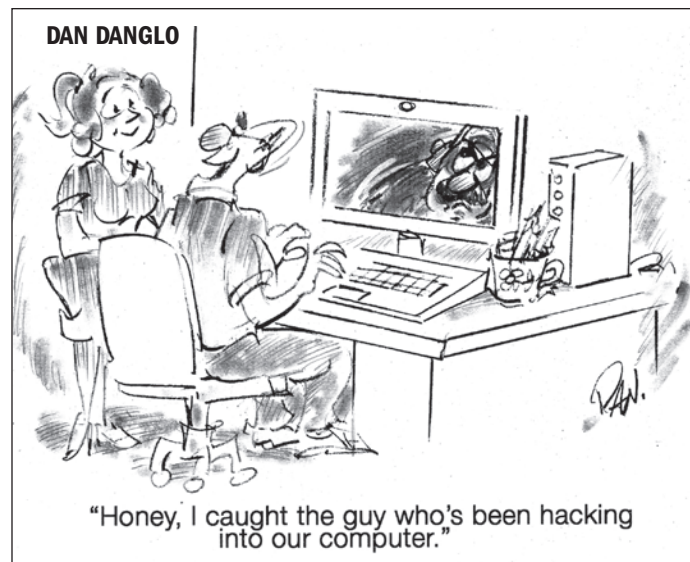

Photoshop, copy and paste one onto a new layer, make it somewhat transparent and look for the differences yourself. Perhaps not as good, but worth a try.

► **I can't drag and drop between documents in the iWork '08 suite. I can't drag an object from a Pages document window to a Keynote window. Is there a setting I can fix? I can drag from the Finder in.**

■ You can drag an image from one to another, but a graphic object you draw nor a selection of text cannot be dragged window to window. You can copy and paste though, so that has the same results. There is no setting that affects this, it's a limitation of the programs. So what's wrong with command-c, command-v ?

Renewal

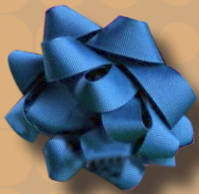

- **REMOTE:** Control the music on your computer or Apple TV from your iPhone or iPod touch.
- **LOOPT:** Connects you with the world around you. Find where your friends are and what they're doing. Supported by over 100 mobile devices across multiple carriers.
- **SHAZAM:** Identify any song on radio, TV, or film. Simply hold the iPhone to the source and within seconds it will identify the song, artist, and track. Free.
- **MOVIES:** Watch trailers and get local show times on your phone.
- **SAY WHO:** Voice Dialing on your iPhone. Simply say the name or phone number.



George Canellis showed us some of his favorites for the iPhone:

- **INSTAMAPPER GPS TRACKER:** Free real time GPS tracking service. Use it to track an iPhone online, share your location with friends, and record tracks for later analysis. Track your phone on Google maps on the internet.
- **ZENBE:** Work with to-do lists or anything you can think of. Share the lists with other iPhone users or over the web. Share a shopping list with family or a to-do list with co-workers.
- **AROUND ME:** Quickly identifies your position and allows you to choose the nearest Gas station, Bank, Restaurant, and many more. You can choose to see the listing on a map.
- **AOL RADIO:** Listen to music from over 150 CBS radio stations across the US. Also listen to News Reports from NY stations such as 1010 WINS.
- **MIDOMI:** Sing it, say it, type it, or grab it. Access 17 million song samples and artists just by singing or humming a few bars. You can even search by saying their name. Try it.



Richard Hickerson talked about how the iPod touch influences his daily life. The Calendar and the To-Do list help organize his activities. Wi-Fi on his iPod for obtaining maps is very necessary when he travels. Videos take the boredom out of

occasional waiting time. Podcasts up-date him on many topics. A favorite is Ken Ray's daily news about Mac issues. Available on MacOSKen.



Richard sums up the value of his iPod with, "It organizes my life, it entertains me, and it educates me."

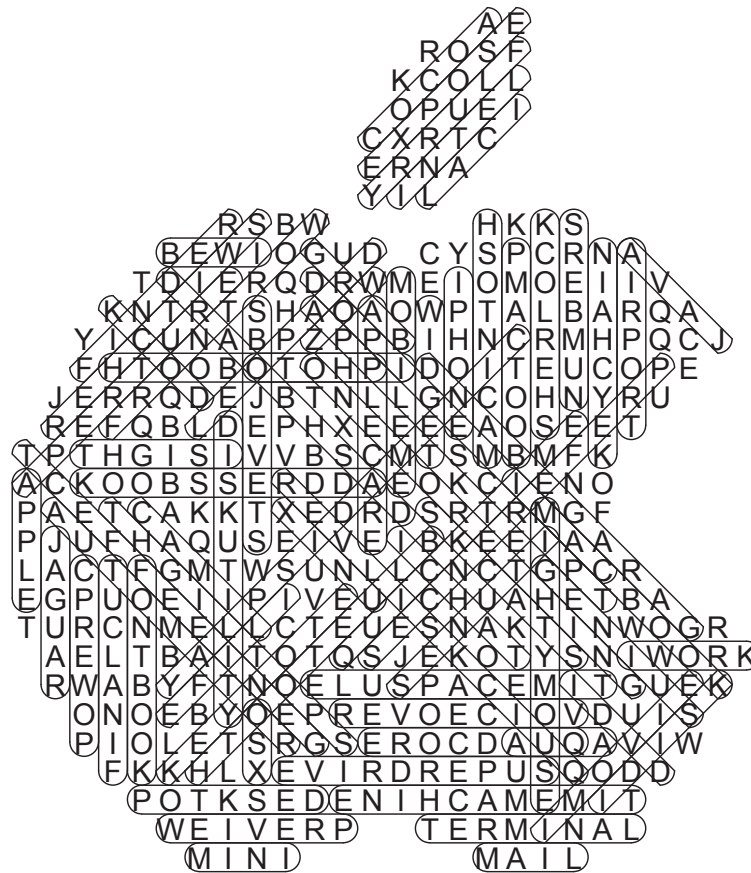
