This July we were treated to a really interesting, and entertaining presentation by Justin Esgar of Autriv Software Development. They make *SignMyPad* (\$3.99) for iPad, *HomeBase* (\$1.99), for iPhone, iPod touch, and iPad, *BlackBook* (\$99.00) for the Mac, and the Autriv Magnetic Stylus (\$19.99) for use on the iPad.

Jason started by explaining what each of his products does. *Sign-MyPad*, is a PDF signature tool. As described on Apple's App Store page; "Open a PDF file on your iPad, and *SignMyPad* lets you sign it, save it, and send it without ever printing it out. No more scanning, no more faxing, and no wasting paper. It's the green solution for people on the go!" *HomeBase*, is a social media management tool for the iPhone, iPod touch, and iPad. It lets you send your message to all of your social media accounts (Twitter, Facebook etc.) all at once. It even lets you add pictures. *BlackBook* is a contact management tool for the Mac. It allows you to:

- Have all your contacts in one place.
- Share your contacts office-wide.
- Set categories to sort people.
- Use the built-in relationship manager to find all contacts from the same company.

The Autriv Magnetic Stylus boasts:

- a smooth silicone tip to insure a clean signature.
- a pocket clip.
- a magnet to attach to your iPad or iPhone.

Next Jason explained his business model, and how others could use it. Jason stated at the beginning, that he is not a programmer. When he gets an idea for an app, he outsources the coding proj-

ect in one of several ways. He will either; outsource it overseas, or post the project on http://www.guru.com/, or http://www. vworker.com/. Potential coders will get back to him with their qualifications, and past experience.


He also suggested that anyone wanting to get into this, should obtain a lawyer, and apply for a patent. He explained, you should apply for the patent as soon as you get the idea, because it is a lengthy process, and can take years before you actually have your patent.

Lastly, he described how to market your product, once it is ready for sale. Below are some of his suggestions.

■ Use your own product. You should do this for two reasons; one to show your

- confidence in the product, and two, to be totally familiar with it, so that you can answer any questions.
- Use social media such as: Twitter, Facebook, and LinkedIn.
- Have a blog.
- Send samples to other bloggers.
- Support your product by answering questions quickly.

Bradley's Tech Session

▶ I upgraded to OS X 10.7 Lion last month and the only problem I

have is I had *Microsoft Office 2004* which no longer works. Now if someone sends me an email with a .pps *PowerPoint* slideshow attachment, I can't open it. I have *iWork*. Can that help? *Keynote* used to open the files.

■ *Keynote* can open the .pps slideshow files as well as the .ppt presentation files from Microsoft PowerPoint. When you updated to Lion, all the filename extension associations in the Launch Services database got reset. What you need to do is, instead of just clicking on the attachement, save the attachment to the desktop. There you select the file and Get Info... on it and look for the Open with: section. You may have to click the disclosure triangle to reveal the details. It should show in the pop-up menu, Microsoft PowerPoint. app, but you can select from the menu, Keynote.app and then click the Change All... button that has now become active, in order to lock in this new assignment for all files with that same filename extension. If you didn't click the button, then only that one file would open in Keynote, the rest would still use *PowerPoint*. Now with the global preference changed, if you get any emails with .pps files as attachments, if you click to open them, they will open with Keynote. By the way, Keynote 5 can open .pptx and .ppsx newer format files as well. You might as well uninstall Office 2004 to

free up space. Ideally of course you should have updated to *Offfice 2011* to work with *Lion. Office 2008* would have worked if you had the installer. They don't sell the older release anymore. Clearly you didn't check your software compatibility before installing *Lion*.

- ▶ I'm looking for a suggestion for an Internet provider for my MacBook Pro. I'm using it for email and streaming audio and videos. I use Verizon for telephone now. I'm getting confused about the various options they have available. Does anyone have experience with their service?
- First off I'd say you need at least 3 Mbps download speed for that. FiOS Double play offers unlimited calling and Internet with 15 Mbps download speeds. They include a wireless router so you can get on without being tethered with a Ethernet cable. That's \$74.99 for the Internet and digital phone service. See http://www22. verizon.com/home/fiosinternet/fastestinternet-plans/. At a lower speed and price point(s), they offer over your existing copper wires, DSL service, known as Verizon High Speed Internet Enhanced. It's \$29.99/month when combined with your existing telephone service. That could be \$54.99 if you have unlimited calling. I can understand your confusion as **thev** seem to be confused about their pricing plans. See http://www22.verizon. com/home/highspeedinternet/#plans It is offered in various tiers, starting at 1.1 to 3 Mbps, 3.1 to 7 Mbps and 7.1 to 15 Mbps rates. The exact price is dependant on dis-

counts if you order online. Those discounts don't apply to phone orders. Your exact address may not offer the higher speeds, so of course the price may be lower than \$29.99/month for the Internet part of the bill. Most people get the self install package of a DSL modem and a set of filters for your telephones, answering machines and fax machines. If you order online, they throw in a wireless router. The bottom line is this with Verizon, \$54.99 for DSL with phone which could be pretty slow, especially when you have to occasionally download a 1GB combo system update, or \$74.99/month for FiOS with 15 Mbps Internet and phone. And that doesn't slow down when your neighbors are using the Internet like Optimum Online service does. Still, Optimum Online is worth looking into. It's \$29.95/month for the first year and you get access to a large network of WiFi hotspots around Long Island. Verizon has WiFi hotspots they say, but I never encountered one. You can keep your existing Verizon telephone service. You get a cable modem, but you probably will want to buy your own wireless router to give you mobile freedom in your home. You can find them most anywhere for \$30 and up. http://www.staples.com/Wireless-Routers-Computer-Accessories/cat CL165748#sor tName='price' & sortOrder='ascending' & s ortDatatype='number'&pagenum=1&vie wDetails='listView' Of course that would support more than the MacBook Pro. It would extend wireless access to a wireless printer or iPad. As for user experience, I have Optimum Online myself, but could have gotten FiOS, but I valued the WiFi network. The steadier speeds of FiOS is good, but for a mobile user, the included

WiFi all around is definitely worth it. Also Verizon charges taxes on everything, so their prices are actually higher than what I've mentioned. Not sure about the percentage, but it could be over 5%.

- I've had Verizon tell me that they don't support Microsoft Entourage or my old Mac? Is that right? It doesn't make sense.
- Literally it does make sense. They, the people don't support it because they are not trained to help users configure their system or application client software to use their service. The Verizon POP3/ SMTP email servers and DHCP modems support even a 17 year old Power Mac 7200 running System 7.5.2 and Internet Explorer or Netscape, but they can't walk you through configuring those programs. They should be able to tell you the settings like incoming.verizon.net and outgoing. verizon.net and let you figure things out. They also won't support new applications that are not popular, again because they have no configuration notes for them. Often the Apple Store staff are just as bad in these matters. That's why it's good to have a membership to our users group or a reasonable good talent at Googling a solution to these configuration problems.
- Why isn't there an iPad app that does OCR for a PDF? Is it the iPad hardware or the software or what?
- OmniPage Pro from Caere started back in 1988, and it was a great product at the time. The iPad 2 has more memory and processing power than what they had then, so the hardware is up to the computational needs. Apple limits what iOS Apps are allowed to do, and OCR is not

allowed now. ABBYY Mobile OCR Engine for iOS is a software development kit that can allow Apps to do this. They use it in their Business Card Reader for iOS. http:// itunes.apple.com/us/app/abbyy-businesscard-reader/id347345474?mt=8 It only is accurate 80-90% of the time. Might be OK for the limited amount of info on a business card. OmniPage Pro X was 99.2% word accurate and there was still plenty of corrections needed for a typical scanned page. The problem is the amount of data and memory and time to process a whole page of text is a problem currently. Not to mention getting a page into a iPad is a problem, as the included camera is not well suited to the task, and regular sheetfed or flatbed scanners don't work with iOS devices. Maybe future work with wireless multifunction devices will help bring the iPad and it's successors up to the

- level we've come to expect in our Macs. It's been suggested a cloud based service could do the processing, but the billing and bandwidth problems would have to be overcome.
- ▶ How can you tell where the slowdown is when you try to access something on the Internet like the New York Times? Is it their server, Internet traffic, cablevision, your neighborhood, or your wireless network?
- You can use the *Network Utility* in your Utilities sub-folder, select the Traceroute tab and type in or paste in the URL of the web page in question. If will show you the IP address of every router between your computer and the web site. Some routers will also show a DNS name. It will also show you how many milliseconds it took to connect to those routers.
