The main presentation for April's meeting was a real treat. Jean Mac-Donald, from Smile Software, demonstrated PDFpen for both Mac and iOS. PDFpen and PDFpenPro are available on both Smile's website and the App Store. Also PDFpen for iPad and PDFpen for iPhone are available on the App Store and the Smile web site. Buying either version on the App Store, gives you iCloud integration, which you will not get on the version purchased from Smile's online store. On the other hand, you will get the updates faster on the version purchased

from Smile's online store. If you don't feel you must have iCloud integration, you can use *Dropbox* sync on the version purchased from Smile's online store. http://sites.fastspring.com/ smile/product/catalog.

Jean started by describing the features new to version 6 which include:

- Microsoft Word export
- New editing bar and enhanced design for better ease-of-use
- Support for Auto Save and Versions
- Optimized for Retina displays' HiDPI mode
- Drag and drop to reorder library items

Jean informed us, that the Microsoft Word export, was the most requested new feature. I can understand that, since most

# **Bradley's Tech Session**

I've got a new iMac 2012 and I got a Western Digital My Book

Essential connected via USB 3.0. I partitioned the drive and formatted it for GUID and Mac OS Extended (Journaled) like I'm supposed to. I set *Time Machine* to back it up and that all went fine and fast. The problem was when I did a test restore of a file from the ~/Documents folder. I got a *Finder* error of zero. I can't find what that means nor a solution. Do you have any ideas?

■ The error zero is a undefined error, so no help there. It's probably a case of the external drive needs a firmware update to be compatible with your Mac. It could be also the WD SmartWare you probably installed. Western Digital offer frequent updates. Check their web site http://support.wdc.com/product/download.asp?wdc <u>lang=en</u> for both types of updates. See also http://community.wdc.com/t5/News-Announcements/bd-p/Announcements The drive was probably sitting in stock for several months and likely did not have the latest software included on disc and not the latest firmware installed. One other thing to watch out for is this, USB 3.0 drives kick up a nasty EMI problem in the usual 2.4 GHz range that Bluetooth and WiFi uses, so this drive could interfere with the proper operation of your wireless keyboard and mouse and to a lesser extent, your wireless connection to your printer and Internet. Keeping it at it's farthest distance will help.

USB 2.0 devices plugged into USB 3.0 ports don't trigger this problem. New Mac mini's (with USB 3) seem to have it worse, presumably because of poorer shielding.

- ▶ I booted up my iMac the other day and I found I couldn't move the cursor from the upper-left corner. It's a USB mouse, so it's not just a battery problem. I restarted and that didn't fix it. What do I do now, bring it in to Apple?
- Well you could do that, but I would first perform a SMC reset. On the iMac, you shut down the computer, then pull the power cord. Wait ten seconds and press the power button. It won't of course turn on, but it does reset a circuit inside. Then put the power cord back in and turn the computer on. I'd guess this will fix the problem.



of the world uses MS Word as their word processor of choice. I for one, was most happy about the new editing bar. I should point out, that Adobe has made Acrobat Pro's editing tools harder to find, while Smile, made PDFpen's easier. Macworld magazine recently reviewed PDFpenPro 6 http://www.macworld.com/article/2033458/review-with-pdfpenpro-6-smile-makes-a-great-pdf-utility-even-bet-ter.html and in the bottom line paragraph said: "PDFpenPro is the crème de la crème of PDF editing and annotating applications." I use it and must say, I agree.

Next Iean showed several of the things you can do with PDFpen. The first thing she showed was editing and adding text in the native PDF format. Most people think you can't do that but PDFpen makes it easy. One of the coolest features is adding your signature to a document. You can scan your signature, save it to a file, and insert it into an open document. You can then make the background transparent, and resize your signature as you like. Once you have your signature in the document (resized and with transparent background) open the Library palette click + --> Add Selected Imprint and your signature will be added to the Library. In my testing of this, for versions of *PDFpen* earlier than 6 the file should be a TIFF or PDF. If you try this with a jpeg, or a PNG file, you can import it into the document, but when you try to save it to the Library, the PNG becomes a black square, and the JPEG is not even recognized by the Library. In

version 6 any file format will work. You can add images to your document, by dragging from your iPhoto Library, or from a folder on your hard drive. Another great feature is the ability to add proofreading marks, and annotations. In addition, you can redact delicate information that you might not want shown in a PDF going out to a wide audience. Jean pointed out, the redaction done in this way is not like using a black marker to cover the information. This redaction, completely removes all the data in that selection. You can also tell PDFpen to redact all instances of that data. \*Jean made certain to explain that any information in the metadata will not be redacted. You must go to inspector --> document information, and remove it

After demonstrating PDFpen's features, Jean went on to describe and demonstrate the features that are unique to PDFpenPro. Among those are document permissions. You can restrict printing and editing of a particular document to anyone who does not have the password. You can also completely password protect the document, so only those you choose can open it. The most compelling reason to go with the pro version is the ability to create cross platform fillable forms. If you have a PDF that is not fillable you can add fields manually, or (new to PDFpen Pro 6) tell the application to detect fields, which evident from the demonstration, it does very well.

Next up, was *PDFpen for iOS*. Jean showed that many of the features of the

desktop version are available in the iOS version. She also showed the iCloud integration, and how the signature in your Library (in fact anything in your Library) is synced to the iOS version.

If you were unable to be present, I can tell you this was a great presentation. Jean's relaxed and humorous approach was well received by all the members. She has an in depth knowledge of the product, and it is quite evident that she loves what she is doing. She fielded every

question with ease. Smile has generously offered LIMac members a 20% discount on any or their products (does not apply to upgrades), if you go to their store and use the code LIMAC13, any time till May 15th. ### iPad Scores Top Spot in JD Power Study Again

The 2013 J.D. Power U.S. Tablet Satisfaction survey results are out, and Apple took the top spot with it's popular iPad. Apple's tablet also scored a five out of five circle rating, and this marks the second year in a row the iPad was ranked as the best tablet.



The iPad scored 836 out of 1,000 in the study, which included rankings based on performance, ease of operation, styling and design, cost, and features.

iPad tops JD Power customer satisfaction survey 2 years running Following Apple in a close second place was Amazon's Kindle Fire with a score of 829. Samsung was third with 822 points, Asus was fourth with 818, and acer brought up last place with 784.

The study included 1,857 people who have had their tablet for less than a year, and found that sharing a tablet tended to result in overall higher scores. Tablets that were shared among four or more people earned a satisfaction score of 853, while single-user tablets earned 28 fewer points at 824.

"It is somewhat unexpected to find that although 64 percent of tablet owners were the sole decision-maker involved in their device

purchase, many of them share their tablet with someone else," commented J.D. Power senior director of telecommunications services Kirk Parsons.

41 percent of the tablet sharers said they plan on buying their next tablet from the same company, while 28 percent of the single-user tablet owners had similar plans. Those numbers are interesting since the iPad currently the best selling tablet, and also topped the J.D. Powers study, yet is also designed to be a single-user device.

This was the second year J.D. Power has conducted its Tablet Satisfaction survey, and so far no other tablet manufacturer has been able to top Apple's scores.

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### Which is worth more, coffee w/Tim Cook or a Lamborghini?

At \$600,000, bidding for a meeting with Apple's CEO approaches a Charitybuzz record



FORTUNE -- It's not Eric Clapton's platinum wristwatch, which fetched \$3.6 million for his Crossroads rehab center, or Warren Buffett's \$3.5 million lunch for the Glide Foundation for the homeless. But it seems likely that bidding for a chance to have coffee with Apple (AAPL) CEO Tim Cook is going to set a record both for the Robert F. Kennedy Center for Justice and Human Rights and for Charitybuzz, the site running their 2013 auction. As of Saturday morning, three days after the first bid, coffee with Cook was No. 2 in Charitybuzz's list of all-time top fund-

raising items, \$5,000 short of the \$610,000 a Lamborghini Aventador LP 700-4 Roadster fetched for the One Drop water foundation in March and nearly double the \$255,000 a day with Bill Clinton raised for the Clinton Foundation in 2010.

All the action seems to be coming from entrepreneurs either hoping to do business with Apple or to drum up some free publicity -- it's hard to tell which. The 86 bids so far include offers from:

ClearCrate -- Cases and accessories for Macs, iPads and iPhones
Drbluetooth --High-end bluetooth headsets

Povely.com -- Bible apps

MacMasi -- iOS and Android games



The Lamborghini Aventador LP 700-4 Roadster fetched \$610,000.
