On the LIMac Home page go and click on the Bulletin Board link (Fig. 1), or go to the pull down menu. Members --> Bulletin Board (Fig. 2)





▶ I just bought a new 27" iMac to replace my older 24" iMac that had

FireWire connections. The new iMac has no FireWire ports. I have a old 1 TB hard drive I had all my files on and a small OWC drive connected to that. I see that Apple makes a Thunderbolt to FireWire adapter. This drive has FireWire 800 ports. Can I use this to connect my drive?

■ Absolutely, that it what it was made for. You can daisy chain FireWire drives together and drive them through this adapter. In fact if you have a (FireWire) bus powered mobile single drive, it **should** work through this adapter as Thunderbolt supplies power in a similar fashion as FireWire ports did.

While native Thunderbolt devices can draw up to 10W, with this adapter, it offers only in fact only 7W of power to FireWire connected devices, a bit less than the available 10W of power spelled out in power class 7 of the FireWire specification.

(Did you know some Macs supplied power over FireWire even when they are powered off? See HT367) The available 7W may not be enough for some bus powered drives, particularly a G-RAID mini or similar twin drive unit. You would have to use the perhaps optional AC adapter or some offered a USB derived power connection to make up the difference. It probably would be a problem getting the detailed specifications of the current/power draw for a particular model mobile

drive. I checked with OWC and they didn't know. The normal AC powered desktop models aren't a problem.

If you didn't need the other Thunderbolt port, you can buy a second adapter and connect the 2nd drive to the other TB port for better speed, rather than sharing the bandwidth of one FireWire channel. While this is not quite related, the adapter cannot work the other way around, connecting a Thunderbolt hard drive to a Mac with a FireWire port.

▶ I'm looking for a multi-function color laser printer for home? What do you recommend?

■ I've recommended Xerox color laser printers, like the Phaser 6600/DN and they have the WorkCentre 6605/DN which adds the ADF/glass on the top. Printing and copying is fine except the scanning software is not good. If you have a dedicated Epson scanner, I'd keep it. These printers have 1200 dpi "enhanced" image quality and the glossy toner makes the images pop. It boasts true Adobe Postscript level 3. Single pass color at 36 page per minute rating is quite fast. At under \$1000 even for the 6605/DN, these are much better than a comparable HP Color Laserjet. I know someone with a Brother MFC-9970CDW which is considerably cheaper. It has smaller paper capacity and not Adobe Postscript but it also does faxing. It uses the Presto!



PageManager scan software which is also sub-par, but he was used to it. If you are looking for something cheaper and more compact for home, Xerox has the WorkCentre 6015/NI. It's slower, no duplex and it comes with only a starter toner set for 500 copies, half filled. If you are looking for smaller and cheaper still, then you'll have to look at a inkjet model. The recently discontinued Epson Artisan 837 is a great all-in-one inkjet with 6 color duplex Airprint capable printing. Best part for some is the full Epson Scan software.

- ▶ I'm running Apple's *Mail* under *OS X* 10.8.4 in Classic view and the blinking insertion point vertical line disappears if I switch from composing a message and switch to another running application. I'm using *DragThing*'s option to "Hide other applications when switching." How can I fix this?
- You can't and it's been a long standing bug with Mountain Lion. The free work around is a quick command-N to compose a new message and then command-W to close that window. That should leave you back where you were with a blinking insertion point. You should also be able to try command-tilde (\mathbb{H}\sigma) twice to switch from the compose window back to the Message Viewer and back. May not work 100% of the time if you have more than two windows open. I've seen an application of the macro program iKey which saves one keystroke. It needed a 0.1 second delay between to allow for Mail to catchup. There's always the option to not hide Mail. Try the yellow dot in the title bar to collapse the window to the Dock instead.

- ▶ I just came across a reference to the Philips Hue color changing LED lights than can be controlled from your iPhone. I understand it's \$200 for the controller and three lights. Can you hook them up to your sound system?
- That is the Philips Hue Personal Wireless Lighting Starter Pack. The hue bridge lets you control up to 50 bulbs. It's \$60 for each additional bulb. These are approximately the same size as ordinary A-19 style E26 medium base bulbs. The bulbs can produce a maximum of 600 lumens at 4000K white point or 550 lumens at a 6500K daylight white point. That doesn't make it very bright, about what a 45W incandescent bulb would produce. They do take a couple of seconds to startup from a command. The bridge gets wired into your network. You can control them from anywhere you have Internet access. They use the ZigBee Light Link protocol of which there are a lot of networkable devices. Besides their own Hue version 1.1 App, there is the MagicHue App. by Peter Breiting and Ambify by Kai Aras. That's probably what you saw. It works with your music library on your iOS device which includes AirPlay which, with your AppleTV, can connect to your stereo system. Check out these examples from their web site.
- ▶ I get periodic e-mails from Macworld magazine, and a recent one was about a way to tweak the RAM when it gets cluttered on the inside, so the machine works better. I didn't understand it.
- What happens when you run your Mac, the memory becomes fragmented. You start up program A and then B, and then

you quit A to free up more memory for program C, but C wants a contiguous block of memory. Now some memory got allocated but it's inactive at the moment. So this program, probably Memory Clean will purge that inactive memory and thus free up more free memory for your next program launch. This will allow the program to run, sacrificing the capability of the remaining programs. This program needs OS X 10.7 or newer to run in the first place, so your obsolete machines can't run it. 10 years ago we used RAM Doubler from Connectix before they went out of business. Mac OS 8 and OS 9 applications back then had memory allocations set

in the *Finder's* Get Info window for the application. It also suffered from memory fragmentation. *OS X* introduced a more dynamic model, but you could still have memory leaks. Restarting would clear all that. Still virtual memory is available up to your available disk space, but some operations won't accept virtual memory. *RAM Doubler* combined memory compression as well as virtual memory. The forthcoming *OS X 10.9 Mavericks* brings back memory compression to modern Intel based Macs. Good news for MacBook Air models with only 2GB of RAM. I hear that battery life is much better too under *Mavericks*.



What you can do on the Bulletin Board?

notified by e-mail that you have a message, make sure that you allow this in your profile --->preferences. Register (if you haven't already) and explore the Bulletin Board.

Facebook, and particularly LIMac's Facebook page. Gary discussed the different ways people use Facebook. He stressed that you don't have to be the type of user who posts ev-
